

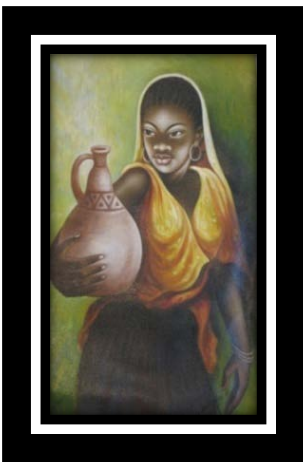
Don't Miss our 2010 CAMPAIGN Update Event!

More qualified nurses will be working in the DRC because of your support. Just think of how many patients and lives will be improved because of these people!



Bizimana, the medical technician at the (NGO) Non-governmental organization, HEAL Africa, continues to manage his team to repair equipment and ensure the facility runs well. Thousands of patients go through HEAL Africa each year, many of them children who would otherwise have no way to have their orthopedic problems corrected and women who need critical care for injuries sustained by war and violence. With your help, we were also able to purchase the oxygen concentrators and package the anesthesia machine—now ready to ship out to DRC. This equipment will save DRC medical facilities thousands of dollars in operations when it reaches its destination. We are also launching a new education project (which you will find in the brochure) for Jim's daughter and son-in-law to donate their time and professional training to teach at a university in DRC.

Thank you again for your generosity and support. We are looking forward to providing you with more information and news as we grow and the CAMPAIGN work continues.
